CHAMPAGNE AND SPARKLING WINES

1900	Asti Spumante Dolce, Araldica (Italy) Refreshing sparkling wine from the north of Italy with a touch of sweetness to the fruit. A refreshing alternative to stickier dessert wines.	N.V.	£23
1920	Blanc de Blancs, Méthode Traditionelle, <i>Vacherin et Clerc</i> (France) Bottle fermented, with a blend of Ugni Blanc, Chenin Blanc, Chardonnay and Colombard, to give a stylish, delicate wine, with crisp citrus and biscuity notes and a fine mousse.	N.V.	£25
1910	Prosecco, Le Couture, <i>Treviso</i> (Italy) Fresh, light and elegant with impressive complexity of flavour, this wine shows aromas and flavours of orchard fruit, citrus, almonds and white flowers, with a soft mousse and beautiful complexity of flavour.	N.V.	£26
1930	Guy de Chasse, Champagne Grand Cru, Brut (France) Only Grand Cru rated vineyards are used to make this family House Champagne. 20% of the blend is made up of older wine to add complexity and depth.	N.V.	£38
1925	Nyetimber, Classic Cuvée, from West Chiltington, Sussex, Brut (England) Superb! Chosen by the Queen for her Jubilee Celebrations. Made in the Champagne style from Chardonnay, Pinot Noir & Meunier. Rich and creamy, showing balance & complexity.	2003	£43
1960	Rosé, Lenoble, Champagne, Brut (France) A wine of delicate salmon pink colour, fine bubbles, a light sparkling foam and a fruity nose with scents of red fruits. Elegant, rounded light and well balanced on the palate.	2004	£46
1940	Moët & Chandon, Brut Imperial (France) Moët & Chandon became the biggest by being the best. Their Brut Imperial really shows why they continue to be hugely successful. Stylish & classy with a fine smooth mousse.	N.V.	£48

WHITE WINES

1004	Sauvignon Blanc, Emiliana, <i>Central Valley</i> (Chile) Pale lemon in colour with hints of green. On the nose, the wine is aromatic, offering fresh floral and citrus notes. The palate has additional notes of tropical fruit and bright fresh acidity.	2009	£16
1890	Un-oaked Chardonnay, Emiliana, <i>Central Valley</i> (Chile) A lighter than usual style of Chardonnay. It has delicious aromas of apple, citrus and stone fruit on the nose followed by hints of peach and green apple on the palate.	2009	£18
1891	Chenin Blanc, Oude Berg, <i>Paarl</i> (South Africa) Lemony crispness and green apple flavours with ripe fruit, tempered by balancing acidity, give a mouth filling, yet refreshing palate.	2008	£18
1780	Pinot Grigio, Sanvigilio, <i>Provincia di Pavia</i> (Italy) A medium-bodied wine, fresh and lively made for easy drinking. On the palate it is delicate and very clean with refreshing acidity on the finish.	2008	£20
1570	Vouvray, Château Gaudrelle, Sec, <i>Loire Valley</i> (France) A medium-dry wine with ripe, concentrated fruit, which compliments the slightly richer seafood and white meat dishes. Made from the Chenin Blanc grape.	2007	£23
1870	Sauvignon Blanc, Eradus, <i>Marlborough</i> (New Zealand) A very mineral New Zealand Sauvignon, where the long growing season produces a fresh & herbaceous wine with some nettly notes. A lovely fragrant wine reflecting the brilliant light quality in Marlborough.	2008	£27

1590	Sancerre, Domaine Gérard Morin, <i>Loire Valley</i> (France) Rich & aromatic Sauvignon Blanc from one of the finest limestone sites. Firmly structured after extended ageing on the lees, it demonstrates a blackcurranty richness and a complex zesty finish.	2008	£29
1460	Chablis, Domaine N&G Fèvre, <i>Burgundy</i> (France) The nose is intense with peach, pear and citrus aromas balanced with a very distinct minerality. The palate is rich and intense with a very nice mineral balance.	2007	£30
1440	St Aubin 1er Cru, en Remilly, Domaine Olivier Leflaive, <i>Burgundy</i> (France) An attractive green-gold in colour, with a delicious nose, poised and fresh with ripe apple fruit, lime zest & passion fruit. Luscious and honeyed, this is toasted, creamy and layered - a lovely wine, finishing long.	2007	£39

RED WINES

1894	Merlot, Panul, <i>Colchagua Valley</i> (Chile) Good aromatic intensity and richness of ripe dark vine fruits, blackberries and blackcurrants. Soft tannins and gentle flavours complete the package of this truly ripe varietal Merlot wine.	2008	£16
1880	Shiraz Stonefish, <i>South Eastern Australia</i> (Australia) Mid weight Aussie Shiraz, packed with soft, ripe dark fruit. On the palate the wine is very gentle and smooth with just a hint of sweetness on the finish.	2008	£18
1892	Malbec, Chamuyo, <i>Mendoza</i> (Argentina) This Malbec is bright cherry red with violet hue. It shows intense aromas of ripe red summer fruit, herbs and subtle warm spice. The palate is medium-bodied, rounded yet fresh with soft, supple tannins.	2007	£19
1897	Cabernet Sauvignon / Merlot, Rooiberg Winery, <i>Robertson</i> (South Africa) A full-bodied, ripe, fruity well-balanced wine with leafy fresh notes and savoury spice on the finish. The classic Bordeaux blend with a modern twist	2007	£19
1830	Rioja Tinto Mirador <i>Rioja</i> (Spain) Just what you would expect from Rioja, a lovely blend of ripe fruit, vanilla and a gentle hint of oak. Outstanding value!	2008	£20
1510	Côtes du Rhône, Domaine de l'Amandine, <i>Rhône Valley</i> (France) A fresh and vibrantly fruity Southern Rhône blend, which is predominantly spicy and smoky Syrah, with the balancing addition of Grenache, Carignan and Cinsault.	2007	£22
1898	Pinot Noir, Reserva, Vinemar, <i>Casablanca Valley</i> (Chile) Purple-pink in colour with a bright nose of spicy ripe plum and cherry. Finely structured and elegant on the palate, with juicy, forest fruit and cinnamon spice flavours.	2008	£23
1100	Château Lescalle, Bordeaux Supérieur, <i>Bordeaux</i> (France) A superb property located on the edge of the famous Margaux appellation. Made predominantly with Merlot grapes, this delicious claret is consistently well made. It has ripe supple fruit and soft tannins.	2003	£25
1400	Fleurie, 'La Madone' Selection Georges Blanc, <i>Beaujolais</i> (France) Fleurie has a distinctly floral bouquet of violets & summer fruits and is perhaps the most elegant and approachable of the Beaujolais Crus. This very fruity wine is full of lush flavours.	2008	£29
1190	Château Batailley, 5me Cru Classé, Pauillac, <i>Bordeaux</i> (France) Two thirds Cabernet Sauvignon to one third Merlot combine to provide an aristocratic wine, succulent and ripe, supported by harmonious tannins and a lingering complex finish.	2003	£48

ROSÉ WINES

1006	La Brouette Rosé, <i>Vin de Pays du Comté Tolosan</i> (France) This is dry Rosé, yet fruity and juicy, with well-balanced supple tannins and lively acidity; it is made from a carefully selected blend of grapes from South-West France.	N.V.	£18
1009	Pinotage Rosé, Laibach Vineyards, <i>Stellenbosch</i> (South Africa) A delightful pale salmon pink, dry rosé. The native South African grape variety Pinotage offers accessible summer fruits and the careful addition of a little Merlot ensures a soft rounded finish.	2008	£22
